QUALITY OF EDUCATION

Our Diploma of Journalism is the most comprehensive of its kind in Australia and offers practical, hands-on experience across all mediums: print, online, radio and television. At Macleay College you will be regularly sent out on assignment to cover politics, courts, sporting events and a whole range of stories that you'd expect to encounter as a journalist. At the completion of your course you'll have an extensive portfolio of published articles, print layouts and designs, photographs and audio and video tapes that can be presented to prospective employers. In your final trimester, you'll also complete an internship with a professional news or media organisation. Macleay College is also the only

educational institution in NSW that offers shorthand as part of its journalism course, a prerequisite for a cadetship on metropolitan newspapers.

PRACTICAL COURSEWORK

The Diploma of Journalism is made up of 12 units. Student journalists begin the year by learning about the basics of what makes a story and how to be a successful reporter. You will have real assignments covering local news and an introduction to the new Sydneysider newsroom, which is Macleay College's award-winning publication. During your year of study at Macleay College you will learn the necessary skills to become a specialist writer – even how to work as a foreign correspondent. You will also learn the skills of video journalism, learning how to use

a camera so that you can report and produce news, current affairs and documentaries. Whether you want to be on TV, or a director, we can show you how.

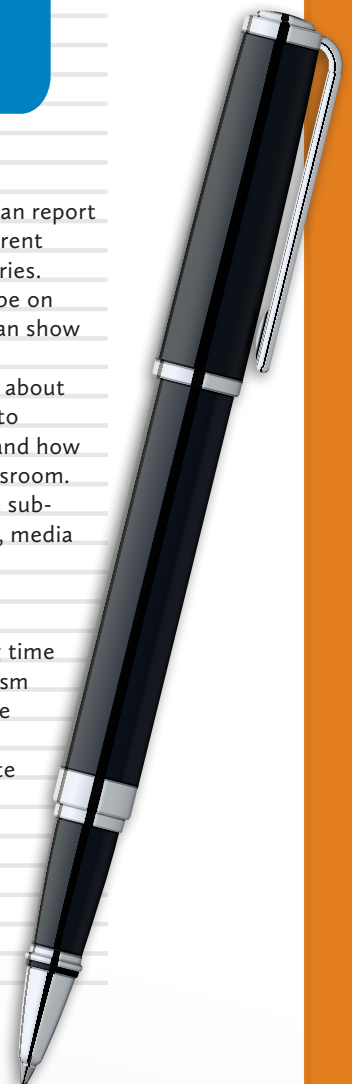
We will also teach you about radio journalism, how to develop a radio voice and how to work in a radio newsroom. Other subjects include sub-editing, news research, media law and shorthand.

NEW CBD CAMPUS IS NOW OPEN

Macleay College opens its new \$2 million campus in Sydney's CBD on January 20, 2012. The new campus is just 2 minutes' walk from Central Station and major transport routes across Sydney. Students who join us in 2012 will discover:

COURSE DETAILS

A full load of study is four units per trimester. It is possible to complete the Diploma of Journalism in a minimum of three trimesters or a maximum of six trimesters.

Part-time enrolment requires completion of no less than two units per trimester.

Admission is based on completion of NSW HSC or equivalent Australian senior secondary certificate.

PATHWAYS TO UNIVERSITY

After successful completion of the Diploma of Journalism, graduates can complete a further 12 months of study at Macleay College to gain a

Bachelor of Arts from Southern Cross University.

HELP WITH PAYING FEES

Macleay College students have access to two loan schemes to help pay their fees: the FEE-HELP loan assistance scheme from the Australian Government or a student bank loan scheme. Contact our Student Services Team for more details.

For Youth Allowance and Austudy, students are generally required to undertake a full-time course and fulfil the normal conditions that apply to those payments. Students who wish to study part time should contact Centrelink to determine whether they qualify.
